








Thinking about how things are in Scotland, how often do you feel the following? % reporting always/often by demographic

\*\*reporting always/often by GE 2024 vote\*\*




#### Which statement comes closest to your view?

Parliament should be able to quickly and efficiently enact new laws, even if it means ignoring some opinions.






#### Which statement comes closes to your view?

IT IS IMPORTANT THAT THE SEATS IN PARLIAMENT LEAD TO A MAJORITY GOVERNMENT.






I prefer a strong leader who makes decisions without compromise.






I PREFER A STRONG LEADER WHO MAKES DECISIONS WITHOUT COMPROMISE


#### Which statement comes closes to your view?

The pursuit of equality and diversity gets in the way of making decisions.






THE PURSUIT OF EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY GETS IN THE WAY OF MAKING DECISIONS



### Who is likely to express more "majoritarian" views towards power?



On a scale from 0 to 10, where 0 is do not trust at all and 10 is completely trust, how much do you trust the following groups and institutions?







When considering associations between gender and trust, the starkest difference in trust is seen in the NHS...


2024 Reform UK voters showed the greatest distrust in politicians...

And trust in the Courts and Judicial system is lowest among the youngest respondents.






NET: Trust (7–10)









Seven in ten say that they always/often vote in elections
